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
Crawl

Smoke rises, so in a fire you should always stay low where there is more oxygen and it is easier to breathe. Use the fire crawl if you have to, and get out as fast as you can!



Flame

A small *flame* can get out of control fast and grow bigger in an instant, which is why kids should never play with fire or try to handle it on their own.





All kids should practice the **escape** routes from their house. Know at least 2 ways you can get out of every room in your house in the case of an emergency.

Sound

Do you know what your fire alarm sounds like? If not, have your parents set it off so you can hear it. Learn that sound; it means, "fire in the house - get out quick!"



Smoke

In an actual fire, there is no time to get dressed or gather your belongings. So if you wake up to the sound of your smoke alarm, it doesn't matter if you're in your pajamas or even stark naked, your only mission is to get out fast!
