Instructions: Read the paragraphs on the left (or have an adult help if needed), and then practice writing the words in the spaces on the right.

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Practice

All kids should **practice** the escape routes from their house. Know at least 2 ways you can get out of every room in your house in the case of an emergency.



Curious

It's OK to be *curious* about fire. But don't let curiosity lead you into doing something dangerous, like playing with fire. Fire can get out of control quickly. In fact, more children die each year by playing with matches and lighters than are killed by guns!



Firefighter

A *firefighter* wears heavy clothes, a mask, and an oxygen tank to protect them from the fire. This makes them sound like Darth Vader. They can also carry an axe and might look a little scary when all dressed up. Just remember: underneath all that garb is a friendly person who is trying to rescue you. Go to them!





In an actual fire, there is no time to get dressed or gather your belongings. So if you wake up to the sound of your smoke alarm, it doesn't matter if you're in your pajamas or even stark naked, your only *mission* is to get out fast!

Defense



Your smoke detector is the first line of **defense** against a fire. Remind your parents to check the batteries twice a year, and have your parents set it off one night after you go to bed to make sure it wakes you up.
